# HOW TO LEARN VOCABULARY? AND NOT TO FORGET IT 

## IMPORTANT RULES

-Organise vocabulary in groups which mean something to you and are not too overwhelming
$>$ It’s easier to learn vocabulary of importance to you - reason with yourself what you need it for
$>$ Read and listen a lot in the language you are learning - you will acquire a lot of passive vocabulary, which will enrich your language
$>$ Be regular - a small amount of time spent on learning regularly is much better than a few hours from time to time
$>$ Revise and put it into practice!


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## HOW TO DO IT EFFECTIVELY?

$>$ Write the words in a notebook together with their definition or translation - use colours, drawings, symbols
$>$ Check the pronounciation and say the word aloud a few times
$>$ Put the words in different groups - use graphic organisers
$>$ Use the words in your own sentences when you speak and write
$>$ Make associations and use mnemonics
$>$ Use computer programmes and mobile apps
